Another Way to Worship Jonah יוֹנַה Dove ' Yod - Hand/God i Vav - Nail/pierce/sacrifice ַ Nun - Hope ה Hey - Behold/proclaim The hand of God nailed in sacrifice proclaims hope. Noah - releases a dove First over the waters like God's spirit over the waters (Gen 1:2) Second brings back an olive leaf (symbol of the messiah) Third enters the land. In Leviticus and Numbers the dove is the poor man's sacrifice. In Psalms the dove is a symbol of escaping to God. In Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Hosea and Zephaniah it is a sign of oppression. In Jonah it is the wayward prophet who is thrown overboard to save the other sailors, spends 3 days in the belly of the deep, then rises to preach repentance to the gentiles.
