Mark 8:26 – 9:1

So far in Mark 6:30-8:26 Jesus has been BUSY doing this:

- tried to mourn his friend John the Baptist but instead served others
- fed 5,000 Jews with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish, leaving 12 basketfuls left over
- walked on water past his disciples, terrifying them then confusing them
- rebuked the Syrophenician woman who wanted healing for daughter, then grants her request based on her logic
- opened the gentile's ears and mouth at once (using touch and spit!)
- fed 4,000 Gentiles with 7 loaves, leaving 7 basketfuls left over
- corrected the Pharisees who wanted to control Jesus & his disciples about hand washing
- taught about what defiles people (what comes out, not what goes in)
- confused his followers about yeast (disciples are again confused!)
- healed a blind man in two stages

Jesus as the Son of Man means this:

"The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again."

Peter's Jesus as Messiah/Savior means this:

The Messiah was depicted as a descendant of David who would be God's agent of deliverance. Endowed with the power and Spirit of God, he will destroy Israel's enemies, gather the dispersed Jews, and reunite the nation. Jerusalem and the temple will be rebuilt and Israel's frontiers will be expanded. The nation will be the jewel and envy of the world. Gentiles will stream to Israel to see God's glory." Lexham Bible
